## Camper Medication Form

If your child is on medication, we encourage it to be taken at home before or after day camp. If your child requires daytime medication however, or has an “as needed” or rescue medication such as an Epinephrine Auto-Injector or asthma inhaler, please see the instructions below.

With the exception of rescue medications, all medications are stored in our Health Centre and administered by our healthcare team who is on site 24/7 (Registered Nurse, Registered Practical Nurse, or Paramedic). On your first day, day camp staff will inform our healthcare team, and they will meet with you briefly to add your child’s medication to their medication administration record.

### Medication Instructions:

- Please send medication in the original container.
- Place container in a Ziplock bag labelled with your child’s first and last name.
- Fill out the *Camper Medication Information* form on the next page, and include this form in the Ziplock bag.
- If your child has an Epinephrine Auto-Injector (EpiPen® or Allerject®):
  - o Please send two.
  - o One will be kept with their counsellor, and it is recommended they carry the other one on them (please provide a fanny/waist pack).
- If your child has an asthma inhaler:
  - o Please ensure it is not expired and it is full.
  - o If you’d like them to carry it on them, please provide a fanny/waist pack.
